### DOG LICENSES

Just a reminder that every pet owner, who resides within the Tulelake City limits and has a dog or dogs 8 months old or older, needs to get their dog vaccinated against rabies AND licensed with the City. It's easy! Just bring proof of rabies vaccination from your veterinarian to City Hall and \$12.00 if your dog is unaltered, \$7.00 if altered and \$5.00 if you are over the age of 60. That's all it takes to be worry free of incurring a citation for violating City ordinance 6.04. Please be respectful of your fellow citizens and remember to keep your dog on a leash! Your dog will thank you and the City thanks you!

**Burn Pit**

Remember the Burn Pit is for yard clippings only! **Do not throw household garbage or furniture** in the burn pit.

You must live within the City limits to use the burn pit. Thank you!

**COUNCIL MEMBERS CORNER**

With the recent weather we have been experiencing it's hard to believe that Old Man Winter is losing his grip on us. But as we know, if it rains, snows and sun shines all in one day, it must be Spring! Soon enough it will be time to start cleaning up all that winter has left behind. Wind has wreaked havoc on our trees leaving branches, leaves and many other such debris on our lawns. All of which should be taken to our City Burn Pit and not put in your garbage receptacle.

This year we will have an attendant at the Burn Pit to monitor and inspect items to be dumped. The Burn Pit is intended for "green waste" such as grass clippings and yard debris ONLY. In order to keep our Burn Pit functioning properly we have to take steps to follow the Burn Pit rules. One such rule is, you **MUST** be a resident of the city to use the Burn Pit. As a city resident, you pay a Burn Pit Fee included on your utility bill to have this service. This fee helps pay for the upkeep, maintenance and equipment used by Public Works to maintain the Burn Pit. Working together we can insure our continued use of the Burn Pit.
