

# Fireworks Show:

Join us at the Malin Park for a spectacular Fireworks show, starting at dusk on July 4th. Check out the many other events taking place in Malin leading up to the show: Start the morning off with a merchant breakfast at the Malin Community Hall from 8am-10am for only \$8.00 at the door. The parade starts at 11am, a swap meet/yard sale will be happening from 8am-4pm, the car show is from noon to 4pm and Night Fire Band will be playing from 6:30-9:30pm so come out early and enjoy all that Malin has to offer!

#### **Dog Licenses:**

Starting July 1, 2019 ALL residents within the city limits MUST have a dog license for their pet! This requires proof of vaccination for rabies.

Dog License Fees (per dog) are as fol-

\$12.00 Male or Female Dog \$7.00 Any Altered Male or Female Dog \$5.00 If Applicant is 60 years of age or

\*Not having a dog license is a violation of City Ordinance and an Administrative Citation of not less than \$25 nor

more than \$500 will be issued, for each violation, to ANYONE not in compliance.

#### **Burn Pit Reminder:**

This is a reminder that grass clippings and yard waste do not belong in the household garbage receptacles! The Burn Pit is open from noon until 5:00 PM, Friday thru Monday for your use. The Burn Pit attendant will direct you to the proper place to dump your waste. It is easily located

by the Fire Department on Ray Oehlerich Way.



#### **Nuisance Abatement:**

Please remember when you are doing yard work not to forget about the area outside of your fence. You are responsible for maintaining the weeds, grass or trees that are growing in front of or immediately adjacent to your property (Ord 8.12.030). Tall weeds and grass become fire hazards very quickly and you will be cited if they are not controlled. The City of Tulelake will be very strict on all fire hazards, health hazards, and any public nuisances

within the city. As the owner or tenant of a residence, you need to be diligent in keeping your property cleared of these hazards. With summer approaching and warm weather ahead, this is important for keeping our community safe.



#### Garbage Alert:

Public Works Crew Members will no longer be picking up any trash that is not inside the 96gallon receptacle, this includes any trash inside other non-approved garbage cans. If you habitually have extra garbage each week that will not fit into your garbage receptacle, you must request a second can. An additional charge of \$25.75 per month will be added to your bill. If you know in advance you will have garbage that will not fit in your 96-gallon can on any given week, you must request an additional can to be delivered to your residence BEFORE your scheduled garbage pickup day. This will count as extra garbage and a \$6.00 - \$25.00 charge will be added to your bill (the can will then be removed after being dumped). NOTE: If any grass clippings or green waste is found inside your receptacle an EXTRA CHARGE will be added to your bill.

#### **Illegally Parked & Abandoned Vehicles:**

The presence of abandoned, wrecked, dismantled or inoperative vehicles or parts, on public or private property, is declared to constitute a public nuisance and is a violation of City Ordinance 10.16. The Police Department will be enforcing this Ordinance and Administrative Citations will be distributed to all property owners found to be in violation. This includes any abandoned machinery, motor craft or anything that reduces the value of private property, invites plundering, creates a fire hazard, creates a harborage for rodents & insects and is injurious to the health, safety & general welfare.

#### **PARK RESERVATION PERMIT:**

Use of our City Parks is free and encouraged! The only requirement is to have a park permit on file at City Hall. This will help ensure you don't plan your event on the same day as someone else at the same park. It will also give Public Works a chance to make sure sprinklers are removed for your event, so reserve your favorite park now for your next birthday party, reunion, anniversary or special event! The permit is good for one full day.

Alcohol is NOT permitted in the Parks unless you have a special permit issued by the Chief of Police.

Veterans Park is open 24 hours a day and Otis Roper Park is open for public use one hour after sunrise and closes at 10:00pm.

#### **BUILDING PERMIT:**

Summer is around the corner and we want to remind everyone that if you are planning on doing any remodeling, new builds or replacing any structures on your property, you need to find out if a City building permit is required. It is important that you get a building permit for required home projects such as electrical, plumbing & structural changes. Permits ensure safe workmanship so you can feel confident in the work being done and help reduce the likelihood of costly mistakes and fines. Building permits are a requirement of the State of California and the City of Tulelake has to comply with the most current issue of the California Building Standards Code. **Below is a list of a few things you can do with-**

#### out a permit:

- 1) Painting, papering, carpeting, cabinets, counter tops and similar work
- 2) Sidewalks & driveways
- 3) Swings & other playground equipment
- One story detached accessory structures (like a shed) provided the floor area does not exceed 120 square feet.
- 5) Decks NOT exceeding 200 square feet in area, are NOT more than 30 inches above grade (the finished ground level adjoining the building at all exterior walls) at any point, and are NOT attached to a dwelling.

These are just a few examples. For more information come into City Hall and discuss your plans with the City Staff and confirm whether or not a building permit is needed.

Happy Spring everyone! A lot has been happening in our City since I last wrote. Raul Figueroa Tama-

We had another public meeting regarding the improvements we want to make to the property adjoining Veteran's Park. The Committee received a number of very well done proposals with drawings submitted by students, as well as other valuable input and ideas made by the public that was present. The suggestions will be reviewed and scaled down to the essential elements. The Tulelake City Council will make the final decision on the project. We have also discussed our local ordinances and the need to enforce them or modify any that might need revision. The City Council is determined to see our Ordnances enforced as they are essential to having our town clean, safe and a healthy environment for our citizens. In order to revitalize our community and enhance its livability, we must enforce and follow these laws! Please remember it is not the City Staff's fault that we are enforcing the rules. City Staff are only carrying out their jobs doing what the law, City Policy, Ordnances & Resolutions require them to do. Being angry with the staff doesn't accomplish anything. If you have a complaint, please fill out a Request Form to be placed on a Council agenda, you may also make a statement during the Public Comment period at a Council meeting or you may file a formal complaint. Complaint forms can be picked up at City Hall. If you have a Police related complaint, you need to pick up a Complaint form at the Police Department. I hope that you will all cooperate with the City Staff and

Departments and help us make Tulelake a community that we can all be proud of!
