PROCLAMATION BY THE MAYOR

Mayor Ebinger declared a Citywide State of Emergency on August 03, 2021, calling for the reduction of all residential and commercial water usage due to the severity of the drought, the lowered static level of the City wells, and the lowered water table levels throughout the Basins which have been causing domestic wells to go dry. Effective immediately, all residential and commercial dwellings shall adhere to the following outdoor watering schedules:

- Residential and commercial dwellings **north of East West Road** shall water their outdoor turf on **Monday's and Thursday's** between the morning hours of **6:00am to 10:00am** and/or the evening hours of **7:00pm to 9:00pm**
- Residential and commercial dwellings **south of East West Road** shall water their outdoor turf on **Tuesday's and Friday's** between the morning hours of **6:00am to 10:00am** and/or the evening hours of **7:00pm to 9:00pm**
- Washing sidewalks and driveways, washing cars or recreational vehicles, or using potable water features are hereby suspended until the Citywide State of Emergency is rescinded.

Thank you for helping do your part in trying to conserve water during these uncertain times.

TULELAKE-BUTTE VALLEY FAIR

The Tulelake Butte Valley Fair Board and Staff are very excited to be moving forward with plans for the 70th annual Tulelake-Butte Valley Fair! The annual celebration will be held Thursday, September 9 through Sunday, September 12, 2021. This year the theme will be "Country Roads Bring You Home". There will be a minimal admission fee of \$4 per person, Thursday through Saturday. Kids 5 and under are free, and Sunday will be free admission for everyone. General parking and accessible parking will also be free this year. Carnival wristbands will be available for \$25 if you buy before September 8th. You will pay \$35 at the door. The four-day unlimited ride wristband will be \$70 beginning in August and going through September 8th. A few of the traditional events that will continue in 2021 are: The annual Farmer and Rancher of the year dinner and replacement heifer sale. As well as the gymkhana horse show/playday in the arena on Thursday, September 9th. The Tulelake Rotary Livestock Auction will be held on Sunday, September 12th at 4:00pm in Jock's Sale Pavilion. There will be free entertainment every day. The AC/DC tribute band "Noise Pollution" will be playing Friday, September 10, and the Destruction Derby will take place on Saturday, September 11. Every day there will be free pony rides, train rides, a petting zoo and much more! Also, remember to practice social distancing! There will be plenty of hand washing and hand sanitizer stations as a reminder to lessen the opportunities to spread germs by touching and re-touching surfaces as well as increased cleaning services throughout the fairgrounds. BUS SERVICE IN TULELAKE - SAGE STAGE

The Sage Stage operates a bus that makes **one** round trip on Thursdays from Alturas to Klamath Falls, stopping in Tulelake to pick up passengers. The bus stops at Ross Market, located at the corner of E and Main Streets. Regular round trip fare is \$12.00. Discount fare is \$9.00 round trip and is available for seniors, children (0-12 years) accompanied by a fare-paying adult and disabled persons meeting ADA criteria.

The Sage Stage operates by reservation. Please call at least one day in advance to reserve your trip. Same day reservations or walk-on's are accepted when possible but be aware that the bus will not run unless there is at least one confirmed reservation. TEXT MY GOV- BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 13TH (A PARTIR DEL 13 DE SEPTIEMBRE)

Introducing a new way to skip a phone call and use your mobile phone's text messaging service to quickly report issues and find information on the go! Smart texting technology evaluates your input and searches keywords in order to provide you with assistance anytime, day or night. You can now sign up to receive notifications via text message. **To Opt-In, text TULETEXTS to: 91896.** After the initial keyword is sent, you will receive a confirmation message asking you to reply YES to verify opt-in. You will receive up to 4 text messages a month with a notification for each alert category selection. View terms and privacy policy info at: textmygov.com/opt-in-terms-conditions. Message and data rates may apply. Check with your carrier for more details. If you would like to Opt-Out: Text STOP at any time to remove yourself from the notification list.

How it works:

Step 1: Text in your question/request for the city to **(530)500-0311**. *Keyword texting examples: Pay Utilities, Office Hours, Report, Animal Control, Park Reservations, FAQ, Contact.*

Step 2: TextMyGov's smart texting technology identifies keywords to instantly provide a response.

Step 3: Depending on what you are trying to accomplish, TextMyGov can provide various types of responses such as:

- Receive a quick answer to your question.
- For information that can be found on your city's website, links will be provided to direct you to the correct place.
- When reporting an issue to the city, TextMyGov will guide you through a series of steps that allows you to submit all the necessary info and even allows you to upload a picture.

Ahora puede registrarse para recibir notificaciones por mensaje de texto. **Para participar, envía TULETEXTSESPANOL al: 91896.** Después de que se envíe la palabra clave inicial, recibirá un mensaje de confirmación pidiéndole que responda Sí para verificar la suscripción. Recibirá hasta 4 mensajes de texto al mes con una notificación para cada selección de categoría de alerta. Ve a los términos y la información de la política de privacidad en: textmygov.com/opt-in-terms-conditions. Se pueden aplicar tarifas por mensajes y datos. Cómo funciona:

Paso 1: envíe un mensaje de texto con su pregunta/solicitud para la ciudad al **(530)500-0311**. *Ejemplos de mensajes de texto con palabras clave: Servicios públicos de pago, Horas de oficina, Informe, Control de animales, Reservas de parques, Preguntas frecuentes, Contacto.*

Paso 2: la tecnología de mensajes de texto inteligentes de TextMyGov identifica las palabras clave para proporcionar una respuesta al instante.

Paso 3: Dependiendo de lo que esté tratando de lograr, TextMyGov puede proporcionar varios tipos de respuestas, como:

- Recibir una respuesta rápida a su pregunta.
- Para obtener información que se puede encontrar en el sitio web de su ciudad, se proporcionarán enlaces para dirigirlo al lugar correcto.
