

BUSINESS LICENSES

Any person owning and operating a business within

the city limits is required to have a business license. This includes landlords, house cleaners and home bakers. Applications to renew your business license have been sent

out for 2025. All proprietors who require a business license are now late and will be required to purchase a license for \$46.20 to operate your business. If you are selling goods, you fall under ordinance 5.04.020 and need to have a business license. Food handlers must follow all food handling rules as required by Siskiyou County before a business license will be issued from the City.

DOG LICENSES

A reminder that ALL pet owners who live within the Tulelake City limits must get their dog vaccinated for rabies and licensed with the City. You will need to bring proof of rabies vaccination from your Veterinarian to City Hall.

Dog License Fees (per dog) are as follows:

\$12.00 Male or Female Dog \$7.00 Any Altered Male or Fer

\$7.00 Any Altered Male or Female Dog

\$5.00 If Applicant is 60 years of age or older All dogs are required to be on a leash. If your dog is caught loose by the Police Officers, they may apprehend your dog and hold them in the dog kennel located at the Police Department until all fees are paid.

Dogs at large fee:

Daily Impound Fee (per dog): \$10.00

1st violation: No less than \$50.00 and no more than \$100.00

2nd violation: No less than \$100.00 and no more than \$250.00

3rd violation: No less than \$250.00 and no more than \$500.00



BUS SERVICE IN TULELAKE - SAGE STAGE

The Sage Stage operates a bus that makes one round trip on Thursdays from Alturas to Klamath Falls, stopping in Tulelake to pick up passengers. The bus stops at Ross Market, located at the corner of E and Main Streets. Regular round trip fare is \$12.00. Discount fare is \$9.00 round trip and is available for seniors, children (0-12 years) accompanied by a fare-paying adult and disabled persons meeting ADA criteria.

The Sage Stage operates by reservation. Please call at least one day in advance to reserve your trip. Same day reserva-

tions or walk-on's are accepted when possible but be aware that the bus will not run unless there is at least one confirmed reservation. For more information or to reserve your spot on the bus, visit their website at www.sagestage.com or you can call their office at 530-233-6410.
