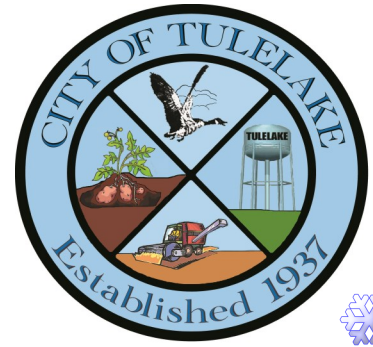

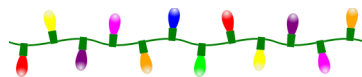
CHRISTMAS CAROLING

WINTER SAFETY TIPS

Drive Safely – Rain, snow, sleet & ice, and fog can lead to hazardous road conditions. SLOW DOWN and make sure your vehicle is ready for winter travel.

Tips To Avoid Strain While Shoveling - Don't shovel right after eating. It's a good idea to stretch before you begin. Shovel only fresh, powdery snow because it's lighter. Lift with your legs, not your back.

Prevent Frostbite - Dress in layers, covering all body parts when you go outside in cold weather.

Winter Activities - Set reasonable limits on outdoor play to prevent hypothermia and frostbite. Make sure kids have a place to warm up when they get cold or wet. Hypothermia can occur more quickly in children. Make sure they come inside periodically to warm up.

Sun Protection - You can still get a sunburn from the sun's rays in the winter, especially when they reflect off snow. Make sure you cover any exposed skin with sunscreen and use sunglasses.

The Burn Pit is **now closed** for the winter. It will reopen in mid March 2018, where the following hours will again be in effect.
Open: Friday, Saturday, Sunday & Monday
Hours: 12:00pm to 5:00pm
Closed: Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday

DOG LICENSES

All dog owners within the city limits **must** purchase a dog license from the City of Tulelake. Dog licenses are good for one year beginning July 1st. Spayed/Neutered dogs are \$7.00, Unaltered dogs are \$12.00 and if the owner is over 60 years of age the price of a license is only \$5.00. Owners must show a proof of rabies vaccine before a license will be issued. Thank you for keeping our community safe.
