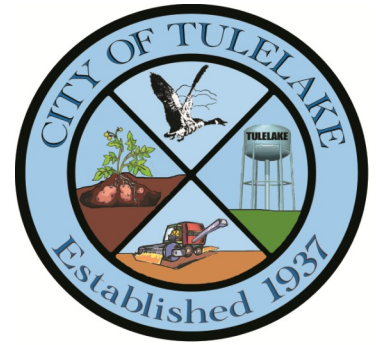

Autumnal Equinox is September 22—Happy Fall!

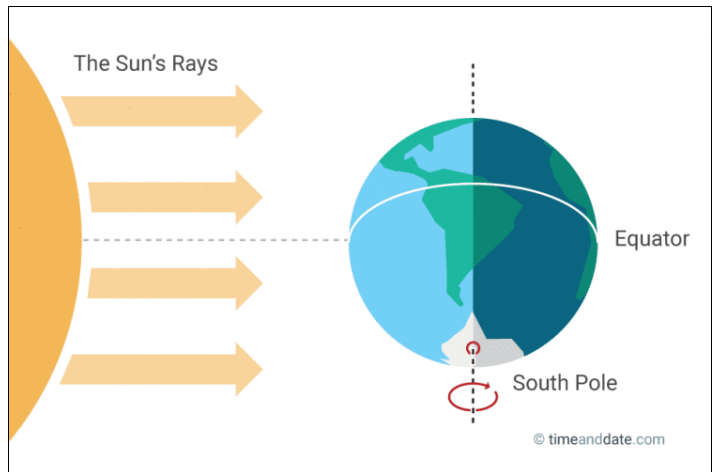
GARBAGE

Just a reminder, occupants of all properties utilizing garbage and refuse collection shall maintain their own receptacles. This means having a can of not more than 40 gallons in size with a secure lid and not weighing over 60 pounds when full. Also, cans that have damage such as broken handles, missing or broken wheels or holes and tears in them are not acceptable. Damaged receptacles need to be replaced as soon as possible with one in good working order that meets the city ordinance requirements (Chapter 8.04). Garbage receptacles must be located where city staff will not be required to go onto private property to provide service (Resolution 10-03, Section 1, D). Finally, if garbage is not in a properly maintained receptacle and just left in a bag on the ground, it will not be picked up.



These changes will be strictly enforced starting on Monday, September 18, 2017. Plan ahead and get your garbage cans now! The Public Works Crew thanks you!

There are two equinoxes every year – in September and March – when the sun shines directly on the equator and the length of day and night is nearly equal.



Earth's position at the September Equinox

OPPOSITE SIDES & SEASONS

Seasons are opposite on either side of the Equator, so the equinox in September is also known as the autumnal (fall) equinox in the Northern Hemisphere, and is considered the first day of fall.

In the Southern Hemisphere, it is known as the vernal (spring) equinox and marks the first day of spring.

The City of Tulelake is operating the Transfer Station located on County Road 95001 (South Stateline Road, West of Sheepy Ridge)

Open: Thursday, Friday & Saturday
Hours: 11:00am to 4:00pm
Closed: Sunday, Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday

BURN PIT

You must be a resident or property owner of the City of Tulelake to use the burn pit. The burn pit is for yard waste only!

Be prepared to show proof of residency to the burn pit attendant, who will also confirm your load is acceptable for dumping.

Open: Friday, Saturday, Sunday & Monday
Hours: 12:00pm to 5:00pm
Closed: Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday

DOG LICENSES

All dog owners within the city limits **must** purchase a dog license from the City of Tulelake. Dog licenses are good for one year starting July 1, 2017. If you purchased a dog license earlier this year you are only required to pay half of the amount by July 1, 2017, and then you are good until July 1, 2018! That way we are back on track with Ordinance 6.04.080. Thank you!
