

UTILITY BILL RE- MINDER

Utility Bills are due on the 10th of each month. If payment is not received by the 20th of the month a reminder notice will be sent to you letting you know you have until the end of the month to make your payment. If your water gets shut off due to non-payment, you must pay your entire outstanding balance plus a \$25 reconnect fee before your water will be turned back on. If you turn the water on yourself, you are “tampering” with city property and an additional \$25 fine will be charged to your account. Please note that the Department of Public Works crew are not available after 3:30pm. **No after hour water reconnections will be done.** A work order will be submitted by City Hall staff and your water will be reconnected the next business day at their earliest convenience.



DOG LICENSES

All dog owners within the city limits must purchase a dog license from the City of Tulelake. Dog licenses are good for one year starting July 1, 2017. If you purchased a dog license earlier this year you are only required to pay half of the amount by July 1, 2017, and then you are good until July 1, 2018! That way we are back on track with Ordinance 6.04.080. Thank you!

The City of Tulelake is now operating the Transfer Station located on County Road 95001 (South Stateline Road, West of Sheepy Ridge)

Hours: 11:00am to 4:00pm

Closed: Sunday, Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday

BURN PIT

You must be a resident or property owner of the City of Tulelake to use the burn pit. The burn pit is for yard waste only! Be prepared to show proof of residency to the burn pit attendant, who will also confirm your load is acceptable for dumping.
