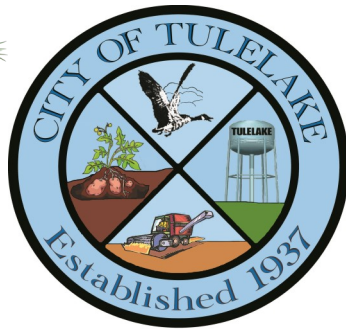

BUS SERVICE BETWEEN ALTURAS, TULELAKE AND KLAMATH FALLS

Sage Stage operates a bus that makes a round trip from Alturas, California to Klamath Falls, Oregon and back ONCE a week on Thursdays. The bus will pick up Tulelake and take a trip to Klamath Falls.

After about four (4) hours, the bus will return the passengers from Klamath Falls to Tulelake. Regular round trip fare is twelve dollars (\$12.00) and discount round trip for seniors and those disabled is nine dollars (\$9.00). Reservations are also available with an appropriate time frame. Honker Cookies with Santa

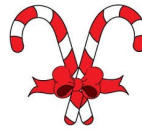

BURN PIT

The Burn Pit is **NOW CLOSED** for winter and will **REOPEN in the spring of 2020** at the following times:

Open: Friday, Sunday, & Monday
 12:00PM-5:00PM
 & Saturday: 10:00AM-3:00PM

Winter Weather Tips:



- * Stay indoors during storms.
- * Walk carefully on snowy, icy walkways.
- * Avoid overexertion when shoveling snow. It's a workout so stretch before going outside.
- * Change out of wet clothes. Wet clothing loses all of its insulating value and transmits the cold more rapidly. Stay Dry!
- * Disconnect and drain all outside hoses and shut off outside water valves, if possible.
- * Wrap water pipes, in unheated or unprotected spaces, with insulation sleeves.
- * Drain your water pipes if your home will be unattended during cold periods.
- * Make sure your furniture is not blocking your homes heating vents.
- * Clear snow from the top of your car, headlights and windows before driving.
- * Don't follow plow trucks too closely.
- * Reduce speeds on snow and ice and increase your braking distance by leaving more room between you and other vehicles.
- * If you must drive in bad weather, travel during the day & keep others informed of your schedule. Stay on the main roads and make sure you have a cold-weather kit in your car with the following items: blanket or sleeping bag, gloves, bottled water, folding shovel, flashlight, first aid kit, hard candy and a cell phone charger.
