ABOUT TULELAKE

- The Modoc War went from July 1872 to June 1873
- Homestead allotments were made available in 1927, 1928 & 1929
- Plans for a residential community was announced in
- The Clyde Hotel was built around September 1936 by Clyde Barks
- Tulelake became incorporated on March 01, 1937.
- Tulelake was the largest of 10 Internment Camps and housed about 18,700 people.
- The Tule Lake Segregation Center closed in March 1946
- A WWII "Veteran only" homestead drawing took place in 1946 where 86 new Veteran Homesteaders won a plot of land by having their names drawn randomly from a pickle jar.
- The Tulelake Butte Valley Fairgrounds was established in 1952 and the first fair was held in 1953.
- At one time, Tulelake had seven restaurants, six liquor establishments, two barber shops and five service stations!

TULELAKE CULTURAL VISITOR CENTER

We are in the final stages of getting the grant to demolish the Clyde Hotel building and you should begin to see it coming down around March 2022. The City is in the process of apply-




ing for another grant to put a Cultural Visitor Center where the Clyde Hotel stands now. This project is a community project which involves the City of Tulelake, Lava Beds National Monument, Fish & Wildlife, The Modoc Nation and many other collaborative partners. We are working together to erect an attractive, interactive facility where visitors can get a feel of the cultural history that surrounds this area. Everything from the Modoc War to the Wildlife Refuge and everything in between will be included in this Visitor Center. Our hope is to get visitors to stay longer and see the many historical sites in our area. Historical and cultural education will be provided by offering classes and handson learning within the facility for school children. The top story of this building would include space for City Hall offices so we would only be responsible for maintaining one building. The current City Hall building would either be sold or leased to another entity for community use. Cross your fingers we get the grant!!

BUSINESS LICENSES

Reminder that Business License renewal applications will be showing up in your mail for 2022. All proprietors will be required to purchase a new license for \$42.00 to operate your business. Any person owning and operating a business is required to have one. This includes landlords, house cleaners and home bakers. If you are selling goods within the City, you fall under ordinance 5.04.020 and need to be licensed. Food handlers need to follow all food handling rules as required by Siskiyou County before a license can be issued in the

If you are wanting to sell goods at an event within the City, you can purchase a daily vendor permit for only \$10.00 per day.

BUS SERVICE IN TULELAKE - SAGE STAGE

The Sage Stage operates a bus that makes one round trip on Thursdays from Alturas to Klamath Falls, stopping in Tulelake to pick up passengers. The bus stops at Ross Market, located at the corner of E and Main Streets. Regular round trip fare is \$12.00. Discount fare is \$9.00 round trip and is available for seniors, children (0-12 years) accompanied by a fare-paying adult and disabled persons meeting ADA criteria.

The Sage Stage operates by reservation. Please call at least one day in advance to reserve your trip. Same day reservations or walk-on's are accepted when possible but be aware that the bus will not run unless there is at least one confirmed reservation.
