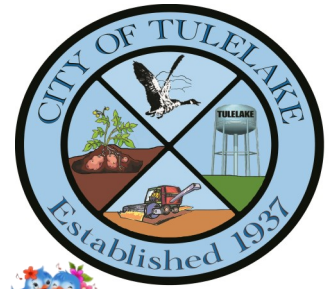

REVITALIZATION COMMITTEE

The Tulelake Revitalization Committee meets once a month at City Hall, 591 Main Street, around 5:30pm. Our objective is to make Tulelake an attractive place in order to entice new businesses and families to lay down roots in our community. Everyone is welcome!

DOG LICENSES & REMINDERS

All residents within the City limits must renew or purchase a dog license for their pet. This requires proof of rabies vaccination.

Dog License Fees (per dog) are as follows:

- \$12.00 Male or Female Dog
- \$7.00 Any Altered Male or Female Dog
- \$5.00 If Applicant is 60 years of age or older.

Not having a dog license is a violation of City Ordinance and an Administrative Citation of not less than \$100 nor more than \$500 may be issued, for each violation, to any owner not in compliance.

Dog licenses are good from July 1 to June 30th.

Landlords, if your tenants own dogs, please notify them that a dog license is required by City ordinance.

All dogs MUST be on a leash or secured in your yard or kennel. Dogs running loose around the City are at risk of being caught by animal control and a fine will be issued to the owner!



BURN PIT

To help keep the weight fees down at the Transfer Station, please take all of your grass clippings and yard waste to the Burn Pit. Please do NOT put green waste in your garbage bin. The Burn Pit is open now through mid-November. The Burn Pit attendant will direct you to the proper place to dump your green waste. It is easily located across from the Multi-County Fire Department on Ray Oehlerich Way.

Burn Pit Hours are as follows:

Friday: 12:00pm - 5:00pm

Saturday: 10:00am - 3:00pm

Sunday & Monday: 12:00pm - 5:00pm

Closed: Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday

Recycle bins are located at the Burn Pit site to recycle your bottles and cans. Please no cardboard!

BUS SERVICE IN TULELAKE

The Sage Stage operates a bus that makes **one** round trip from Alturas to Klamath Falls, stopping in Tulelake on Thursdays. The bus stops at Ross Market on the corner of E and Main Streets for passengers. Drop off options in Klamath Falls are: The Airport, Amtrak/Greyhound Station, Walmart or the Basin Transit Downtown Transfer Center. After about four (4) hours in Klamath, the bus will return passengers to Tulelake. Regular round trip fare is twelve dollars (\$12.00) and discount round trip for seniors and those disabled is nine dollars (\$9.00). Reservations are also available with an appropriate time frame. BUSINESS LICENSE

If you do business, meaning any kind of calling carried on for a profit or livelihood, in the City of Tulelake, you must have a business license on file at City Hall. The annual fee is only \$42.00 and keeps you in compliance with Tulelake Municipal Code, Title 5.

WEED ABATEMENT

This is already a really dry year so please keep the fire danger low and your neighbors happy this summer by keeping your weeds and lawns cut! Don't forget to pay attention to your shrubs and trees and keep all their broken, dried limbs off of your home, garage and storage sheds. Be sure to take all of your yard clippings to the Burn Pit. Adhere to the City's Nuisance Abatement Ordinance to avoid fines and a civil penalty from the City. The first offense is \$100, the second offense is \$200 and two or more separate occasions within a one year period, the owner shall be liable to the City for a civil penalty of \$500 for each separate order to abate. Take the time to keep your property free of weeds and clutter and show some pride in your town. Old vehicles and equipment are also considered a nuisance and the civil penalties are the same if you are in violation.

SUMMER WATERING SCHEDULE

This is a critical year with our water shortage and we strongly suggest you do your part and follow the City guideline for watering this summer. You may only water your lawn twice a week. Flowers and vegetable gardens may be watered more than two days per week but only as needed, making sure that you follow the odd/even day schedule for your address. This rule also applies to swimming pools and the days that it can be filled. Depending on where you live in the City, your watering day will be on an *odd* or *even* day of the week. Residents living on **The north side of E Street: EVEN** days. **The south side of E Street: ODD** days. City residents who violate the City of Tulelake mandated odd/even, two day per week outdoor watering schedule will be fined accordingly: first offense \$50, second offense \$250 and third offense \$500.

Closed: Sun. Mon. Tues. & Wed.

TULELAKE DMV

The California Department of Motor Vehicles will begin offering quarterly office hours at its Tulelake facility. Area residents will be required to wear face coverings and maintain physical distance during the COVID-19 pandemic emergency, when the DMV is open. Driving tests will be offered by appointment only and can be scheduled by visiting dmv.ca.gov, calling 800-777-0133 or stopping by the office in-person when someone is there. DMV examiners will follow health and safety protocols. Tulelake residents are encouraged to take this opportunity to apply for a REAL ID, which requires an office visit to complete the application. Starting in May 2023, you will need a REAL ID or another federally approved form of identification to board flights within the United States, and enter secure federal facilities and military bases. Before going to the office, visit REALID.dmv.ca.gov to fill out the online application, upload necessary documents and print your confirmation code. Bring your documents and confirmation code with you to the DMV office to finalize your transaction. We are working hard to get the Tulelake Office open more than once every quarter. We appreciate your understanding as we work through this process.

 - Faxes: \$1 per page
 - Returned payment: \$25
 - Online bill pay: approx. 3% of total bill
 - Automatic credit card payment: \$3.00
 - Credit card payment by phone: \$10.00
