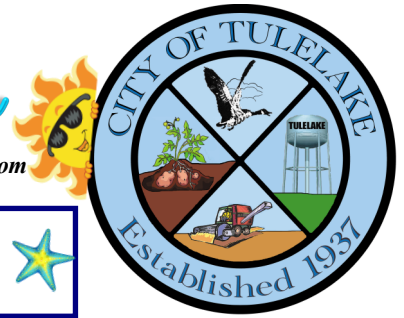

DOG LICENSES

Not having a dog license is a violation of City Ordinance 6.04 and an Administrative Citation may be issued. All dog licenses are due by July 1, 2022. You can purchase a license for your dog at Tulelake City Hall with proof of rabies vaccination.

Dog License Fees (per dog) are:

\$12.00 Male or Female Dog

\$7.00 Any Altered Male or Female Dog

\$5.00 If applicant is 60 Years of age or older

Citations for not having a dog license can range from \$100 to \$500 to any owner not in compliance.

All dogs MUST be on a leash or secured in your yard or kennel. Dogs running loose are at risk of being caught by animal control. As well as paying a fine, owners will also be required to vaccinate and license your dog and pay any impound fees.



TULELAKE 2022 ELECTION

Declare your candidacy between July 18 and August 12, 2022 for any of the following upcoming available positions: City Council Members (3), City Clerk or City Treasurer. All positions are full-terms ending November 2026. You must be a registered voter and a resident of the City of Tulelake (within the City limits). Contact City Hall for more information.

UPDATE ON CLYDE HOTEL

The City was fortunate to receive the Community Development Block Grant for removal of the Clyde Hotel and the Mix Tienda buildings. Both of these buildings are considered public safety hazards and the actual removal of the buildings will happen during the summer months of July and August. Our Public Works and Police Departments will be rerouting traffic during building demolition. The City is very excited as plans for the future Tulelake Cultural Visitor Center will be established in their place. We look forward to working with our collaborative partners within the community for this future project. If you would like to be involved in this project please attend the Tulelake Revitalization Committee Meetings.

SUMMER WATERING SCHEDULE

On March 28, 2022, Gov. Newsom signed Executive Order N-7-22, which takes effect immediately, to prepare for and mitigate the effects of the ongoing drought.

The City of Tulelake will be enforcing the following watering schedule in order to conserve water:

The NORTH Side of E Street: EVEN days

Residents living on the NORTH SIDE of East West Road (E St.) will water on EVEN calendar days: *Example the 2nd, 4th, 6th, 8th etc...*

The SOUTH Side of E Street: ODD days

Residents living on the SOUTH SIDE of East West Road (E St.) will water on ODD calendar days: *Example the 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th etc...*

Make sure to follow the ODD/EVEN day schedule for your address. See map below for additional clarification. Filling swimming pools, washing cars, and sidewalks must be done on your watering day. Flowerbeds and vegetable gardens may be watered as needed. Please water responsibly!

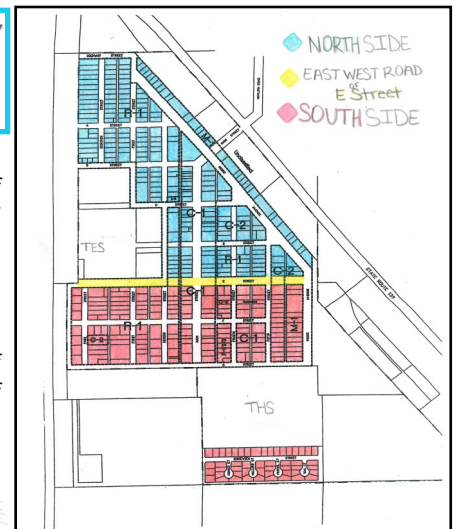

LIBRARY NEWS

The library is happy to introduce a new benefit to your library card! From now, through June 2024, you can check out a California State Park Pass. The pass will give you free entry to the day-use area of 200 California State Parks. The pass can be checked out, just like a book, and can be kept for 3 weeks. All you need is a library card to check it out! You can get a library card at the Tulelake Library, Noon to 5, Mon-Wed...or you can apply online at www.siskiyoulibrary.info

Not all California State Parks are accepting the pass and it is not good for overnights, such as camping, but it is accepted at Castle Crag State Park and Burney Falls! Garbage will be picked up on these days during the holidays:

May 30: Memorial Day

Picked up on Tuesday, May 31st

July 4: Independence Day

Picked up on Tuesday, July 5th

September 5: Labor Day

Picked up on Tuesday, September 6th

Please make sure to put all of your garbage bags in the can. Anything not in the can may not be picked up or will be an additional charge on your bill.

**NEW HOURS FOR PUBLIC WORKS CREW!**

**TEXTMYGOV (UTILITY BILLS)**

You can now sign up to receive notifications via text message regarding your utility bill! To opt-in text TULELAKEUTILITY to 91896. After the initial keyword is sent, you will receive a confirmation message asking you to reply YES to verify opt-in. You will receive notices and a link to your bill.

You can also set up online bill pay using your account number. You just go to our official City website at www.cityoftulelake.com click PAY MY BILL and set up your account! If you have any questions please contact City Hall.

CITY PARK RESERVATION PERMIT

Use of our City Parks is free and encouraged! The only requirement is to have a park permit on file at City Hall. This will help ensure you don't plan your event on the same day as someone else at the same park. It will also give Public Works a chance to make sure sprinklers are removed for your event. So reserve your favorite City Park now for your next birthday party, family reunion, anniversary or any other special event.

Alcohol is NOT permitted in the Parks unless you have a special permit issued by the Chief of Police. Pick up your application at City Hall or get it off our website: www.cityoftulelake.com and enjoy your day!

BURN PIT

The Burn Pit is now open. The hours will be as follows:

OPEN: Friday, Sunday & Monday 12:00pm - 5:00pm

Saturday 10:00am - 3:00pm

CLOSED: Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday

Remember the Burn Pit is for City residents only and is to be used for yard clippings only, do not throw household garbage in the Burn Pit. Thank you!

Water meters are read anywhere from the 17th to the 22nd of each month. Please **do not** park your vehicles over the meters around that time of month. It makes it difficult for the Public Works Crew to read them. Thank you!

**BUS SERVICE IN TULELAKE - SAGE STAGE**

The Sage Stage operates a bus that makes one round trip on Thursdays from Alturas to Klamath Falls, stopping in Tulelake to pick up passengers. The bus stops at Ross Market, located at the corner of E and Main Streets. Regular round trip fare is \$12.00. Discount fare is \$9.00 round trip and is available for seniors, children (0-12 years) accompanied by a fare-paying adult and disabled persons meeting ADA criteria.

The Sage Stage operates by reservation. Please call at least one day in advance to reserve your trip. Same day reservations or walk-on's are accepted when possible but be aware that the bus will not run unless there is at least one confirmed reservation.
