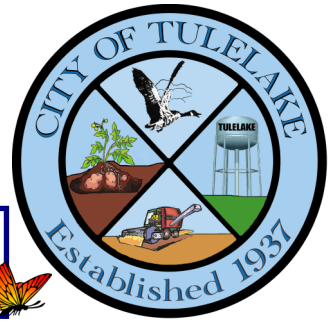

ART OF SURVIVAL CENTURY BIKE RIDE

Our 9th annual Art of Survival Century bicycle ride will start Saturday, May 28, 2022. Choose from a 100 Mile century, metric century (59 mile), 38 mile route, family friendly (14 mile) or a 22 mile mountain bike route! This fun event is an opportunity to learn about a region that includes Southern Oregon's Klamath Basin and Northern California's Tulelake Basin and Butte Valley areas. This year we are celebrating "Water is Life". Local farms, ranches and thousands of species of plants and animals rely upon a water supply from the Cascade Mountains for survival in our High Desert Basin. Then on Sunday, May 29, 2022, drive a quick 30 minutes to Dorris for a ride on gravel roads less traveled! Choose from either a 13, 54 or 74 mile route, all through the scenic valley.



Saturday: Most rides begin at the Malin Park but check your map for exact locations and start times for your ride, as well as Aid Station locations. All routes pass through the Lava Beds National Monument.

Sunday: Ride along the flat lands, by the Butte Valley wildlife area and up to Juanita Lake.

The ride begins at the Dorris Lions Club/Butte Valley Community Center. Check your map for start times for your ride and Aid Station locations.

Don't delay, early registration is through May 20, 2022 and you can register online at survivalcentury.com.

This is an inclusive event. All are welcome here and we can't wait to meet you! Ride with us once, and you are forever part of the Survival Century family.

DOG LICENSES

A reminder that ALL pet owners who live within the Tulelake City limits must get their dog vaccinated for rabies and licensed with the City. You will need to bring proof of rabies vaccination from your Veterinarian to City Hall.

Dog License Fees (per dog) are as follows:

- \$12.00 Male or Female Dog
- \$7.00 Any Altered Male or Female Dog
- \$5.00 If Applicant is 60 years of age or older

All dogs are required to be on a leash. If your dog is caught loose by the Police Officers, they may apprehend your dog and hold them in the dog kennel located at the Police Department until all fees are paid.

Dogs at large fee:

Daily Impound Fee (per dog): \$10.00

1st violation: No less than \$50.00 and no more than \$100.00

2nd violation: No less than \$100.00 and no more than \$250.00

3rd violation: No less than \$250.00 and no more than \$500.00



VETERANS PARK UPDATE/REVITALIZATION COMMITTEE

We are nearing completion of our Veterans Park Expansion. The gazebo is up except for the final top piece which will be added soon. The installation of electrical will be the last item to finish off the gazebo. The long grass area by the restrooms will be the designated "pet area" and we will install a doggie waste station for responsible pet owners to be able to clean up after their pet. The Tulelake Revitalization Committee is working hard to come up with concepts for the Veteran's Memorial Wall for design and installation later this summer in which to honor our local, brave Veterans. We are also trying to get a few new garbage cans and some picnic tables to add to the park. We may need to fundraise in order to get as many as we want. SPRING CLEAN-UP DAY- EARTH DAY



The clean-up days for 2022 have been set for Thursday, April 21, 2022, and Friday, April 22, 2022. The City will again have two large roll-off bins for household type garbage and one large bin for acceptable metal items. This year the bins will be located at the Wastewater Plant located off of Dean Callas Way. The bins will be open from 7:00AM to 3:30PM during our clean-up days.

If you have things like tires with no rims, electronic waste and paint cans with lids, you must take them to the Transfer Station. They are not allowed by Waste Management and won't be accepted in the roll-off bins. The Transfer Station will be open at its regular hours from 11:00AM to 4:00PM. Regular fees will apply.

PLEASE NOTE: THESE BINS ARE FOR CITY OF TULELAKE RESIDENTS ONLY! YOU MAY BE ASKED TO PROVIDE PROOF OF RESIDENCE.

GARBAGE HOLIDAY PICK UP SCHEDULE

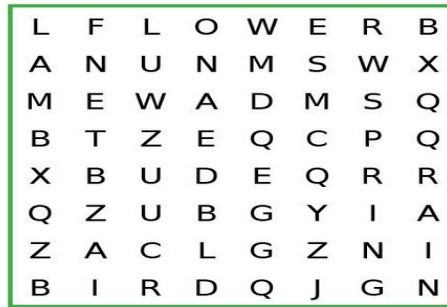
Garbage will be picked up on these days during the holidays:

BUS SERVICE IN TULELAKE - SAGE STAGE

The Sage Stage operates a bus that makes **one** round trip on Thursdays from Alturas to Klamath Falls, stopping in Tulelake to pick up passengers. The bus stops at Ross Market, located at the corner of E and Main Streets. Regular round trip fare is \$12.00. Discount fare is \$9.00 round trip and is available for seniors, children (0-12 years) accompanied by a fare-paying adult and disabled persons meeting ADA criteria. The Sage Stage operates by reservation. Please call at least one day in advance to reserve your trip. Same day reservations or walk-on's are accepted when possible but be aware that the bus will not run unless there is at least one confirmed reservation.
