The City of Tulelake is operating the Transfer Station located on County Rd. 95001 (South of Stateline Rd. & West of Sheepy Ridge)

It will continue to be open regular hours as follows:

**Open:** Thursday, Friday & Saturday Hours: 11:00AM to 4:00PM

If you own property in the city limits that have water and/or sewer connections to it, you are responsible for all applicable utility fees. This includes, but not limited to, empty lots, vacant houses, garages, sheds, second or back houses, etc. that have connections to them.

Using water and/or sewer service at any of the above listed places is considered theft of services from the City of Tulelake if you are not paying for them. Please contact City Hall if you

have questions or if you need to sign up an unregistered water or sewer service.



### **Miscellaneous Fees:**

There is a charge for the following items:

- Lost/stolen/damaged garbage can: \$100 •
- Meter/meter box damage: \$100/\$150 •
- Requested water shut off/on: \$50
- Water shut off standby for repairs: \$15
- Meter tampering: \$100
- Account changes: \$25
- Copy of business license: \$5
- Copy of utility bill/any copies: \$.25 each
- Faxes: \$1 per page

# **Tulelake Butte Valley Fair**



The fair once again is here! This year you will notice a few changes. After a public meeting to get ideas to generate funding for the fair, it was decided to charge a minimal admission fee of \$4.

Kids 5 and under are free. The fair is selling Season Passes for \$10 per person. On Friday, September 6th kids 12 and under will have free admission. Sunday, September 8th is free admission for all ages! General parking and accessible parking is free this year! Reserve your VIP parking for only \$50 for a 4-Day Pass. Carnival wristbands are \$25 if you buy before September 4th. You will pay \$35 at the door. A carnival Unlimited 4- Day Pass can be purchased for \$70 until September 4th. Wristband prices do not include admission.

There will be free entertainment every day. Journey Revised Tribute Band will be playing Friday, September 6th at 8PM. Don't miss the Destruction Derby on Saturday, September 7th at 7PM and the Rotary Livestock Auction on Sunday beginning at 2PM. There will be lots of other entertainment as Diamond Gem rides again! The City of Tulelake has recycling bins located at the end of C. St. near Otis Roper Park. Acceptable items are glass and plastic containers with lids removed, tin and aluminum cans. Please sort items into appropriate bins and DO NOT bring any paper products, household garbage, yard garbage, oil containers, cardboard, lids or Styrofoam products because they will not be accepted. Recycling is not collected everyday therefore be considerate and maximize your recycling by planning ahead. ### **Dog Licenses:**

A final reminder that dog licenses must be obtained for **all** dogs within the city limits. Dog licenses are now considered late.\* All

dogs must have proof of rabies vaccination before a license will be issued. A dog license will cost the following (per dog):

\$12.00—male or female dog

\$7.00—any altered male or female dog

\$5.00-if applicant is 60 years of age or older.

\* Not having a dog license is a violation of City Ordinance 6.04 and an Administrative Citation of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$500.00 will be issued, for each violation, to ANYONE not in compliance.

### COUNCIL MEMBERS CORNER


