

### **ELECTION DAY!**

the heart of our democracy and it sends a direct message to the government about how you, a citizen, wants to be governed. Let your voice be heard, be an educated voter and do your research before casting your vote!

If you are not a registered voter, you can get a registration form at the post office, city hall or online through the California Secretary of State (http://registertovote.ca.gov) You must be a United States citizen, a resident of California, not imprisoned, not on parole for the conviction of a felony and at least 18 years old at the time of the election. You must be registered at least 15 days prior to an election to be eligible to vote in that election.

### **ONLINE BILL PAY**

We are still working on our online bill pay program in order to offer you the option to pay your utility bill online. We have continued to have some setbacks but we are diligently working on resolving them. You should soon see an option on our website (www.cityoftulelake.com) that will direct you through the sign up process to pay your bill online.

There will be a small service charge fee (anywhere from \$2.50 - \$3.50) for the convenience of paying online. This is not a fee the City is charging and the City does not benefit from this fee. This fee is imposed by the bill provider for maintaining this service for you and goes directly to them. We are still working on the final details but hope to be up and running soon!

### **DOG LICENSES**

A final reminder that dog licenses must be obtained for **all** dogs within the city limits. Dog licenses are now considered late.\* All dogs must have proof of rabies vaccination



before a license will be issued. A dog license will cost the following (per dog):

\$12.00 - Male or female dog

\$7.00 - Any altered male or female dog

\$5.00 - If applicant is 60 years of age or older.

\* Not having a dog license is a violation of City Ordinance 6.04 and an Administrative Citation of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$500.00 will be issued, for each violation, to ANYONE not in compliance.

### **CITY GRANTS**

The City has been fortunate to receive the State of California Prop 68 grant to expand Tulelake Veterans Park. We hope to announce our groundbreaking soon in September. Watch for the announcement on our website or on a flyer around town. With ideas from the Tulelake elementary and high school students, this grant came about with the collaboration between the City, the Tulelake Revitalization Committee, the National Park Service, the Tulelake Rotary and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife.

The City also continues to work on low-to moderate income home loans with down payments and part of the closing costs for first time buyers. There is a process for acquiring a home loan so please contact Jenny at City Hall for the details.

In June the City received another grant from SB 2 state money to start the process of updating the City's General Plan, help with rezoning costs, cover Certified Environmental Quality Analysis costs, and to develop packets for home or business entrepreneurs.

We are serious about this and will be sending fines to those who don't cooperate. This includes trash, old cars and machinery, other debris and junk, also lawn and yard debris. The City wants to see the community cleaned up so it can be a safe, enjoyable place to live for all of us!

Don't forget to vote on November 03, 2020! We have several candidates and important measures on the ballot. Please don't confuse the TOT tax measure as a tax on you. It is a tax that travelers would pay when they are staying in a motel, hotel, or bed and breakfast establishments within the city. There is also a Public Safety measure on the ballot asking you to pay a small tax so that we can have enhanced Law Enforcement services and more effectively fund our Police Department.
