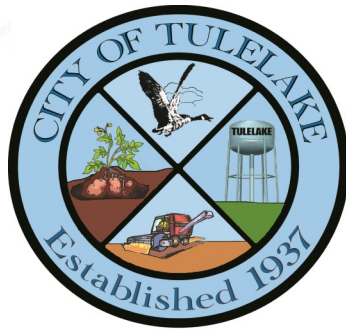

Daylight Saving Begins Sunday March 10, 2019

TERMS, CONDITIONS, & FEES FOR UTILITY SERVICE WITH THE CITY OF TULELAKE:

- Deposits for Utilities - The amount which is twice the monthly amount for the full basic service charges for water, sewer and garbage and any associated fees.
 - Reconnect Water Service for Non-payment- \$50.00
 - After Hours Call Out for Water Reconnection- \$100.00
 - After Hours Water Turn Off/On for Customer Repairs- \$50.00
 - Water Service Modification- \$50.00 (**Customer Request ON/OFF**)
 - Water Service Standby- \$15.00 (**To fix broken pipe, etc.**)
 - Water Meter Tampering- \$100.00 (**Water turn ON/OFF by customer**)
 - Utility Account Changes- \$25.00 (**Name changes, etc.**)
 - Returned Payment (NSF)- \$25.00

- If water is utilized at any service location during any portion of a billing cycle, the basic water service charge will be assessed in full to the financially responsible person.
 - Water & Sewer charges will apply whether or not the water is on or off or if the structure is occupied or vacant. (**Unless Owner requests water to be off plus pays \$50 fee**)
 - If water service is discontinued due to lack of payment, when the account is in the name of the property owner, service will not be reconnected in the name of another until the outstanding balance for all utility services are paid in full.
