

HOUSING ELEMENT COMMUNITY MEETING

On December 06, 2022, The City Council Meeting will have a presentation and Q & A session from Planwest Partners Inc. to get public and council input on the City of Tulelake's Housing Element.

The State of California requires all local governments to adequately plan to meet the housing needs of everyone in a community by analyzing a community's growth and development of all income levels, and strategize ways to provide for those housing needs. The Housing Element is a key part of the City's overall General Plan and includes these eight elements: land use, transportation, conservation, noise, open space, safety, environmental justice, and housing. The State requires that Housing Elements be updated every eight years to reflect the most recent trends in demographics and employment that may affect existing and future housing demand and supply.

BUSINESS LICENSES

Any person owning and operating a business within the city limits is required to have a business license. This includes landlords, house cleaners and home bakers. Applications to renew your business license will soon be sent out for 2023. All proprietors will be required to purchase a license for \$42.00 to operate your business. If you are selling goods, you fall under ordinance 5.04.020 and need to have a business license. Food handlers must follow all food handling rules as required by Siskiyou County before a business license will be issued from the City.

CHRISTMAS TREE LIGHTING & JOLLY JAMBOREE


