NUISANCE ABATEMENT

All property owners and tenants in the City recently received a letter for nuisance abatement. Everybody is responsible for maintaining the weeds, grass or trees that are growing on the property. Tall weeds and grass become fire hazards and you will be cited if they are not controlled. The City of Tulelake will be very strict on all fire hazards, health hazards and any public nuisances within the City. As the owner or tenant of a residence, you need to be diligent in keeping your property cleared of these hazards.

LIVESTOCK

As it is currently written, Ordinance 6.08.20 states that "No Livestock shall be possessed in the City of Tulelake, nor shall any livestock be pastured or allowed to run loose upon any lot, vacant lot, street, alley or avenue in the City." Ordinance 6.08.010 defines Livestock in this chapter to mean and include, but shall not be limited to: horses, cattle, sheep, hogs, rabbits, ducks, geese, chickens and other fowl. Ordinance 6.08.025 says, "No Livestock shall be slaughtered, butchered, skinned or gutted on any zoned residential property in the City." Please be aware that having these animals within the City is a violation of City Ordinances and punishable by civil penalties.

SUMMER WATERING SCHEDULE

The NORTH Side of E Street: EVEN Days

Residents living on the NORTH SIDE of East West Road (E St.) will water on EVEN calendar days: Example the 2nd, 4th, 6th, 8th etc...

The SOUTH Side of E Street: ODD Days

Residents living on the SOUTH SIDE of East West Road (E St.) will water on ODD calendar days: Example the 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th etc...

Make sure to follow the ODD/EVEN day schedule for your address. Filling swimming pools, washing cars and sidewalks must be done on your watering day. Flowerbeds and vegetable gardens may be watered as needed. Please water responsibly!

DOG LICENSES

All dog licenses are due by July 1, 2023. Purchase your dog license at Tulelake City Hall with proof of rabies vaccination. Not having a dog license is a violation of City Ordinance 6.04 and an Administrative Citation of no less than \$50 and no more than \$500.

Dog License Fees:

\$12.00 Male or Female Dog \$7.00 Any Altered Male or Female Dog \$5.00 if Applicant is 60 Years of Age or Older All dogs must be on a leash or secured in your yard or kennel. Dogs running loose are at risk of being caught by animal control. As well as paying a fine, owners will also be required to vaccinate and license your dog and pay any impound fees.

BUS SERVICE IN TULELAKE - SAGE STAGE

The Sage Stage operates a bus that makes one round trip on Thursdays from Alturas to Klamath Falls, stopping in Tulelake to pick up pas-

sengers. The bus stops at Ross Market, located at the corner of E and Main Streets. Regular round trip fare is \$12.00. Discount fare is \$9.00 round trip and is availa-

ble for seniors, children (0-12 years) accompanied by a fare-paying adult and disabled persons meeting ADA criteria.

The Sage Stage operates by reservation. Please call at least one day in advance to reserve your trip. Same day reservations or walk-on's are accepted when possible but be aware that the bus will not run unless there is at least one confirmed reservation.
