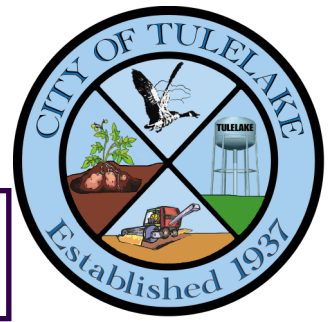

**DOG LICENSES**

The City has an Ordinance in place (Ord. No. 6.04.020) that requires all residents, with an animal over eight months old, to obtain a dog license. It's easy! Just bring proof of rabies vaccination from your veterinarian to City Hall and \$12.00 if your dog is unaltered, \$7.00 if altered and \$5.00 if you are over the age of 60. That's all it takes to be worry free of incurring a citation of no less than \$50 and no more than \$500, for violating the City Ordinance.

**CALTRANS CLEAN-UP DAY**

This year Caltrans is extending their clean-up day to our side of the county! It is scheduled for Saturday, March 25, 2023, and is reserved for Siskiyou County residents only. Get started on your spring cleaning and take your "unworthy to donate" items to the Transfer Station located on County Road 95001 (South Stateline Road, West of Sheepy Ridge Trailer Park). The bins will be open from 11:00AM to 4:00PM. Please note that these bins will be free to Siskiyou County residents only. Be prepared to provide proof of residence upon request. Not everything will be accepted at the Transfer Station for free. Things like appliances, tires & electronic waste will be at their regular charge.

Welcome to the 10th annual Art of Survival Century Bicycle Ride! On Saturday, May 27, 2023, choose from a Century, Metric Century, 38 Mile, 14 Mile or Mt. Bike, bicycle ride! All rides will start and end at the Malin Community Park in Malin, OR.



Sunday, May 28, 2023, choose from a 74 Mile, 54 Mile or 13 Mile Family Route. All rides will start and end at the Butte Valley Community Center in Dorris, CA.

We will have our Pre-Ride Reception on Friday, May 26, 2023, from 4:00pm to 6:30pm at the Malin Broadway Theater located on Broadway Street in Malin, OR 97632. Pickup your rider's packet and merchandise, discover and select area activities for your extended stay, tour our community and enjoy light refreshments and a visit with the locals.

The Art of Survival Century Bike Ride is an opportunity to learn about a region that includes Southern Oregon's Klamath Basin and Northern California's Tulelake Basin and Butte Valley area. What is unique about this event, is that each rest stop offers educational components and/or ranger or historian led talks highlighting the cultural history, geography, environmental issues and geology of the area.

## BUS SERVICE IN TULELAKE - SAGE STAGE

The Sage Stage operates a bus that makes one round trip on Thursdays from Alturas to Klamath Falls, stopping in Tulelake to pick up passengers. The bus stops at Ross Market, located at the corner of E and Main Streets. Regular round trip fare is \$12.00. Discount fare is \$9.00 round trip and is available for seniors, children (0-12 years) accompanied by a fare-paying adult and disabled persons meeting ADA criteria.



The Sage Stage operates by reservation. Please call at least one day in advance to reserve your trip. Same day reservations or walk-on's are accepted when possible but be aware that the bus will not run unless there is at least one confirmed reservation.
